Trees for Various Purposes

Plant the right tree in the right place. Sound simple enough, doesn't it? Tree selection can seem to be a complex, time-consuming process, but it doesn't have to be with the right information at your fingertips.

You may have the size or shape of a tree in mind or it may be a problem site, such as a wet area, that is your concern. What should you plant? The following lists are some suggestions of trees, listed by special features, that will aid you in the selection of the best tree for the site you have in mind.

1. Trees for Moist Soils

Although it is usually advisable to try to drain areas where water stands for any length of time, the following trees will withstand moist soil conditions better than most.
